Registration

10 a.m. until 1 p.m. shoot starts at 10:30 a.m., earlier if club rules allow.
The fee is \$14.00 for 50 birds
Subtracted from the fee is \$1.00 for hidden score purse, \$5.00 towards the Leagues Fund for the purchase of merchandise to be awarded at the Trophy Shoot, leaving \$8.00 for the club holding the shoot that day.
A minimum of 7 shooters (high score) is to be fielded at each shoot, per club. If the minimum is not attained, a penalty of minus 3 birds off the lowest score will be assessed to the number of missing shooters.

Club Scoring

1st – 4 points
2nd – 3 points
3rd – 2 points
4th – 1 point

Shooting Rules

A.T.A. rules will apply.

Each club to use the same trap setting, #2 on a White Flyer trap; other settings for other manufacturers apply in order to comply with A.T.A. rules. (Example: #1 for Beomat traps)

Unsafe Gun Handling

1st offense, the shooter is taken off the squad.

2nd offense, the shooter is disqualified from the League for the remainder of the year.

3rd offense, the shooter is disqualified from shooting at League shoots completely.

Shooters Responsibility

Each shooter is responsible for checking the master sheet before leaving each shoot. Any score under protest should be corrected the day of the shoot; otherwise the master sheet stands.

Class Shoot

This will be held at the April shoot. To be eligible, shooters must have three shoots prior to April.

Classification of shooters will be based on the average of the highest 3 of the first 5 shoots. Abnormally low scores may be disregarded and known ability may be considered by the league committee.

The league committee will drop the lowest scores from shooter's averages if they have shot more than the three required scores before the trophy shoot.

(Example: if a shooter has shot all five of the shoots prior to the trophy shoot, the league committee will count only the highest three towards their average.)

High Average Gun – Highest average shooter for the year including the Trophy Shoot

Ties:

Ties for class champion or high average gun will be shot in-groups of 10 targets (2 from each station) until best score out of 10 wins.

Ties for team trophy will be settled by each team electing 1 shooter to shoot best of 10 targets as above. If tie remains, two new shooters will shoot for best of 10, etc.

Trophies and Awards

A trophy will be awarded to the winning club (most points) and is to be held until the following League Season. Donated by F.M. Shooting Sport (Frank McCraig).

High Average Gun will be awarded First pick of the table
Special Prize for High Average, having shot all six shoots
Class A Winner will be awarded Second pick of the table
Class B Winner will be awarded Third pick of the table
Class C Winner will be awarded Fourth pick of the table
Class D Winner will be awarded Fifth pick of the table
Class A Second will be awarded Sixth pick of the table
Class B Second will be awarded Seventh pick of the table
Class C Second will be awarded Eighth pick of the table
Class D Second will be awarded Ninth pick of the table
There will be a junior prize if warranted.

Anyone winning Classes A,B,C,D First or Second and High Average Gun will be removed from the random prize table draw.

Prize Table Draw will be awarded by a random draw (first drawn = first pick of the table, and so on) until all names are drawn or the table is empty. Only the persons shooting in the Trophy Shoot are eligible for the Prize Table Draw.

Individual clubs may modify the above prize draw procedure if necessary to suit the restrictions within their own clubs.

Pins will be awarded to any shooter eligible to shoot in the trophy shoot.

Trophy Shoot:

1. To be eligible to be classified and therefore to be eligible to compete in the trophy shoot you must have competed in at least 3 of the first 5 shoots.
2. To be eligible for the High Average Gun Trophy you must have competed in at least 3 of the first 5 shoots plus the trophy shoot. The High Average Gun will be based on high average score not a total birds hit.

Classification:

Class A – 88.0% and over
Class B – 81.0% to 87.9%
Class C – 73.0% – 80.9%
Class D – 72.9% and down

Shooting in Advance:

Competitors that are not able to attend a particular shoot will be allowed to shoot in advance on a regular shooting day, at the club holding the next shoot, between the past league shoot and the upcoming event they cannot attend. Competitors

must announce their intention to shoot ahead and pay entrance fees in advance of shooting. This shooting ahead will only be allowed once during the season.

Clubs are under no obligation to provide any special arrangements, outside of regular shooting activities, to provide for this option.

Note: The trophy shoot cannot be shot in advance for either individual or team score.
